Chiloe National Park and City of Chonchi.



You will be picked up by your guide at your hotel after enjoying your breakfast and we will head south along the Pan-American Highway for 20 kms.(12 miles). Right after Chonchi, which we will visit during the afternoon on our return to Castro, we will continue west to the Cucao area on the West coast of the island and, southern entrance to the Chiloé National Park with more than 42,000 has.(105,000 Acres) bordering the Pacific Ocean. We will walk the light El Tepual trail before having lunch* at a local restauarant. After lunch we will return to Chonchi to visit its World Heritage Church. Return to the hotel will be approximately 5:00 p.m.

*Lunch is from a fixed menu with a veggie option. First non-alcoholic drink is included.





TREKKING & FAUNA

Tepuhueico Park



Parque Tepuhueico is a nature project situated in the heart of Chiloé Island, covering an area of 20,000 hectares (5000 acres) of native forest. During our excursion, we will take a walk through the park's trails, where we can explore the Myrtles Cathedral, have a glimpse of the beautiful waterfall that drains from Lake Tepuhueico, and enjoy the stunning flora and fauna that is present in the area. It is a perfect place for bird watching, and we may even spot some rare species such as Pudu and Darwin's Fox. If the weather allows, we can also visit Chonchi and enjoy a hot beverage after lunch. Our return to Castro is scheduled for approximately 5:00 p.m. This excursion is a must-see for nature enthusiasts who want to explore the beauty of Chiloé Island.

CHURCH ROUTE

East Coast, coastal villages



We will begin our journey from your hotel and head towards the north. After covering half the distance between Castro and Ancud, we will take the road towards the East that leads to the city of Quemchi. This is where Francisco Coloane, the National Literature Prize winner, has deep roots. We will visit his House Museum and then proceed towards Aucar Island, which is also known as the Island of Navigating Souls, as named by Coloane himself. To reach the island, we will walk on a wooden walkway that is more than 500 meters long. Next, we will head towards Colo, where we will see the smallest heritage church of Chiloé. After that, we will visit Tenaun and San Juan, where we can see more heritage churches and visit a shipyard that makes wooden boats. Finally, we will return to Castro, stopping at Dalcahue to visit its heritage church and crafts fair. We will return to Castro at approximately 5:30 p.m.





NATURE & CULTURE

Puñihuil Penguin Colony & Historic Ancud

Join us on a fascinating journey to the north of Chiloe Island. This historically rich area is home to many captivating sights. Our adventure begins with a visit to the Puñihuil Bay, which is a National Monument due to its unique feature of being the only place in the world where both the Humboldt and Magellanic penguins nest together. We will board a boat and head to the islets, where we will observe penguins, cormorants, pelicans, kelp geese, and the occasional sea otter for around thirty minutes. After a delicious lunch, we will travel to the city of Ancud, which was once the capital of Chiloé. Here, we will visit the fort and the "Fundación Amigos de las Iglesias," which is dedicated to the restoration and promotion of World Heritage Monuments (UNESCO). We will return to Castro in the afternoon, arriving at approximately 5:30 pm.





CHURCH ROUTE

Island of Lemuy

We will travel to the southeast of the island until we reach the port of Huicha in Chonchi, where we will take a ferry to reach Lemuy Island. This island is home to 8 wooden churches, out of which 3 have been recognized as World Heritage Sites. Our tour will start with a visit to the 3 heritage churches, namely Ichuac, Aldachildo, and Detif. We will also get to admire the beautiful Quehui and Chelin islands from a stunning viewpoint, and explore various scenic spots of the island.



TREKKING

Tantauco Park (Yaldad area)



We will begin our day by traveling towards the southern part of the island. Just 14 kms (8 miles) before reaching Quellón, we will take a gravel road that leads to the Yaldad sector. This is the northern entrance to Tantauco Park. Once there, we will embark on a 2-hour walk (medium level) along the Yaldad River, which will lead us to the park's Visitor Center. Here, we will enjoy a gourmet picnic lunch while taking in the stunning view of the lake that shares the same name. After lunch, we will explore the Visitor Center before taking the light Siempreverde Trail. We will then return to the gate and head back to Castro around 5:30 p.m



CITY TOURS

Castro y Chonchi

Our excursion will take us to two important cities on the island,
Castro and Chonchi, both of which are home to heritage churches and have a unique Chilote beauty.
During the tour, we will visit stilt houses, waterfronts, markets, and the most notable points of interest in each of these emblematic cities of Chiloé. This half-day excursion is approximately 4 hours long, and we will take a break at a local coffee shop where you can enjoy a cup of coffee, tea, or hot chocolate





SPECIAL INTERESTS

Kayaking the Fjord of Castro



We will begin the activity with a brief introduction and safety briefing about the activity we will carry out and the correct use of the equipment. We will paddle for approximately 3 hours on kayaks, visiting the Palafitos (houses on stilts) and the Ten Ten point.

Depending on the tide and weather conditions, the guide will decide if it is possible to cross to the Quento/Tongoy sector or otherwise stay on the west bank of the fjord going up the Gamboa River.

We will enjoy a healthy and energetic snack while we are on board before returning to the dock where we began the activity.



INTERESES ESPECIALES

Kayak at Dawn in the Sunken Forest




Kayaking in the mist of the sunken forest of the Chepu River is one of our favorite activities. It is surreal to witness the logs of dead trees that are mute witnesses of the natural catastrophe that occurred in 1960. The land sank with the strongest earthquake ever recorded by humans (9.5), and a tsunami flooded the valley leaving behind the sunken forest. For this exclusive excursion, we will leave Castro in the afternoon of the previous day and stay at an agritourism in Chepu. We will have an early dinner and rest as we start early the next day. We will head to the pier before sunrise to get into our kayaks, enjoy a hot drink and a snack before we begin paddling upstream towards the sunken forest of Chepu. We will paddle for 2 to 3 hours among dead trees and the river's fog at that unique time of day. After the kayaking experience, we will return to the agrotourism to have a farm breakfast with local products to replenish all the energy before returning to Castro at lunchtime.

Birding on the Archipelago



The island boasts of unique habitats and ecosystems, making it an ideal sanctuary for a wide array of bird species. These areas of high ecological value are known as "hotspots" for birdwatching. Chiloé Natural offers various excursions to locations with high sighting targets such as Caulín, Putemun, Pullao, Curaco de Vélez, the Pacific Coast, among many others. 
Knife Forging
